

Thompson Okanagan FC Coach Code of Conduct

- 1. Coaches will place the emotional and physical well-being of the players ahead of any personal desire to win
- 2. Coaches will always keep their players' best interests at heart and will do their best to teach them the game of soccer through a positive attitude, good sportsmanship and fair play
- 3. Coaches will always strive to maximize the individual potential of each player and to provide an equal opportunity to learn to all player
- 4. Coaches will develop a team spirit and encourage each player to support one another
- 5. Coaches will respect players, parents, and game officials, and encourage each player and parent to support and respect the game officials
- 6. Coaches will do their best to ensure a safe and secure playing environment
- 7. Coaches promise to review and practice the necessary first aid principles needed to assess and, where appropriate, treat injuries of the players
- 8. Coaches will advise and demand that their players, the players' parents, assistant coaches, and managers respect all Club Codes of Conduct
- 9. Coaches will pre-plan and organize practices
- 10. Coaches will provide opportunities for all players, assistant coaches, and team staff to become knowledgeable in all rules and regulations pertaining to the BCSPL
- 11. Coaches will use soccer coaching techniques appropriate for the development of the age group being coached
- 12. Coaches will remember that they are youth coaches and that the game is for the benefit and development of the children and youth
- 13. Coaches will praise and encourage players
- 14. Coaches will vow to be a positive role model to their players at all times
- 15. Coaches will not use inappropriate language at any time during practices, games, or while traveling
- 16. Coaches will demand a playing environment that is free from alcohol, drugs, and tobacco
- 17. Coaches will do their best to create and maintain an enjoyable atmosphere for players, game officials, volunteer staff and parents
- 18. Coaches will always put the players' safety, care and feelings ahead of their own

- 19. Coaches will not condone bullying of any team member. Coaches will take appropriate action to resolve an issue in a fair, timely, and consistent manner
- 20. Coaches acknowledge that the welfare of the player is, and must always be, the paramount consideration
- 21. Coaches acknowledge that all persons, especially children/youth, have a right to be protected from abuse, regardless of age, gender, culture, language, racial origin, disability, religious beliefs, or sexual orientation
- 22. Coaches must adhere to all guidelines laid out by BC Soccer regarding conduct
- 23. Failure to comply with the above may result in temporary or permanent removal of coaching privileges
